- 2. Postcode
- 3. To what extent did the respondents feel that option C is a suitable approach to achieve a better, safer and less polluting traffic system?
- Scores of 1 to 7
- With 1 being not at all suitable to 7 being completely suitable
- This question had a free text answer box so respondents could explain their scores
- 4. Which mitigation measures would you like to see alongside option C? (and where)
- Speed limit reductions
- Additional/improved pedestrian crossings
- Traffic calming measures e.g. raised tables, road narrowing
- Street character/public realm improvements e.g. planting, signage, seating
- Measures to address traffic noise
- 5. Any other comments on the traffic modelling study

Q3 findings

- If we take it that scores of 1, 2 and 3 don't feel option C is suitable, then **573/974 (58.8%) don't feel it's a suitable option**.
- 298/974 (30.6%) scored option C's suitability as 5, 6 and 7

Qs 2 and 1 findings

- 729 of the respondents (74.8%) have BA15 1 or BA15 2 postcodes.
- 904 of the respondents identified themselves as local residents and/or local businesses.
- 61/974 (6.3%) of the respondents classed themselves as someone who drives to or through the town.
 (In hindsight, we might have been better making these 2 options distinct in the feedback form although the number of respondents in the combined group is low)

Q5 findings

- 79/974 people/households (8.1%) commented that doing nothing would be better or preferable to option C (and/or any of the options)
- 120/974 people/households commented in favour of having a 20mph posted speed limit either throughout the town or in the town centre.
- 112 people/households included the word 'Covid' in their comments. 86 used the word 'pandemic' and 50 mentioned 'lockdown'

There is likely to be some overlap between these responses i.e. some of the 112 references to Covid may well have mentioned pandemic and/or lockdown as well.

Further analysis could provide this level of detail – but for now we've just focused on the number of respondents using each of these words.
