Background

In the first Residents' Panel Survey for the 2024/25 year – we asked about 5 topics:

- Bradford on Avon Cemetery
- litter and recycling
- extending our Christmas Lights
- this year's Green Man Festival
- Seniors' Forum.

Half of the panellists responded to the survey (50) – representing a slight increase in engagement from the previous survey but still down from the average response rate (65).

Full responses will be sent to the relevant officers to help inform their work.

Bradford on Avon Cemetery

Would you be interested in an open day where you are given a tour of the cemetery and its facilities?

More than half (56%) of those who completed the survey said they would not be interested in tours of the cemetery.

Do you have any ideas about alternative uses for the chapels?

Panellists suggested a number of alternative uses for the chapels, including:

- artisan workshops
- exhibition spaces
- a museum
- modern office space
- event venues (weddings, music etc).

A small number of panellists suggested one of the chapels should stay as chapels for funerals, memorials or similar ceremonies.

Do you have any ideas about use of the cemetery house?

- holiday lets
- emergency accommodation
- rental property.

Management of Bradford on Avon Cemetery

Would you like to see more meadow areas at the cemetery?

Most panellists (82%) said they would like to see more meadow areas in the cemetery. However, 8% said they did not want more meadowed areas.

Would you like to see more tree planting at the cemetery?

Again, most panellists were in favour of more tree planting in the cemetery (76%).

Would you like to see us install bird and/or bat boxes or other wildlife features?

90% of panellists were in favour of more wildlife habitat features in the cemetery.

Would you like to see more benches or other seating?

While most panellists (72%) were in favour of more benches – one said if more benches are installed at the cemetery, they should be as memorials.

Do you have any other ideas for the cemetery?

A common theme running throughout these answers emphasised the desire for more wildlife habitat features. Other ideas included information boards and dedicating an area for reflection.

Promoting recycling campaign

Do you think there is a problem with litter in Bradford on Avon?

Over half (54%) of panellists believed litter was a problem in the town.

Did you know that some of our litter bins have separate recycling bins?

An equal number of people knew and did not know about the recycling facilities on some of our bins.

In your opinion, what approaches, or messaging would be most effective in motivating people to take larger recyclables home with them?

Panellists gave a range of answers including:

- notices on bins
- use positive or humorous messaging
- dog waste was a larger issue than littering
- more bins
- publicise the issue in the town council newsletter
- educate people on recycling.

Some panellists suggested fines handing out fine – however this is not something the town council has the powers to do.

Unfortunately, the town council does not have the powers to issue fines. Others believe it was typical to take away larger recyclables and some believed that it would be difficult to change people's behaviours.
