#### 57. Declarations of interest

Clirs Kay and Lomax declared a non-pecuniary interest in Planning Application 18/08705 – 44 Whitehill.

#### 58. Minutes

It was proposed by Cllr Garwood seconded by Cllr Lomax and with all in favour <u>RESOLVED</u> that the minutes of the meeting held on the 27<sup>th</sup> November 2018 and the 12<sup>th</sup> December 2018 (delegated minutes) be approved as true record and signed by the Chairman.

59. <u>Correspondence relating to planning applications to be considered at this meeting</u> There was none.

60. Planning Applications

- (i) It was proposed by Cllr Lomax seconded by Cllr Garwood and with all in favour **RESOLVED**: to forward the planning recommendations on the attached sheet to be sent to Wiltshire Council.
- (ii) <u>Delegated Decisions</u> Planning Application 18/11198/FUL 15 Elms Cross Drive, Bradford on Avon was considered under Delegated powers and was recommended to be REFUSED. Comments being forwarded to Wiltshire Council.

#### 61. Chairman's report

Cllr Kay reported that the installation of scaffolding required for insertion of Solar Panels on St Margaret's Hall roof was now completed. Installation work commencing 14<sup>th</sup> January with a completion date of the 18<sup>th</sup> January.

<u>Plastic Free</u> - The 'Plastic Free' initiative was progressing well; receiving a huge response from over 45 businesses who had expressed an interest in changing at least one way of initiating the Plastic free initiative. A screen showing of the film 'Plastic Ocean' in St Margaret's Hall on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> January at 7.00 p.m. was planned. She reported that Bradford on Avon Rowing Club were organising a river clean-up and investigating purchasing refillable shampoo dispensers.

<u>Water Fountains</u> – Cllr Kay reported that Wessex Water had granted £1500 towards the proposed Water Fountain project with a further grant of £1500 being granted by Bath and West Community Energy Fund. She said that 3 companies had been approached for funding and a total of £7000 had been sourced towards the project. Further funding was being sought from the Area Board.

<u>Living Wall</u> – Cllr Kay reported that she was researching the idea of a 'living wall' in Bradford on Avon. Cllr Gibson requested that Cllr Kay and her work together on this.

Westbury Gasification Incinerator at Northacre, Westbury

The facility will provide a sustainable, long term solution for non-recyclable waste by using it to generate renewable energy. It will keep Wiltshire's waste in Wiltshire, reduce the amount that tax payers and businesses currently spend on transporting non-recyclable waste around the UK and Europe, and will

reduce the amount of the region's waste currently going to landfill. Correspondence had been received inviting Cllrs from Bradford on Avon Town Councillors for their comments and support on this project. An in depth discussion took place about the benefits and advantages/disadvantages of this proposed plant. It was **agreed** that Cllrs Gibson and Kay, with the assistance of Nigel Gerdes, would draft a letter to be sent to Wiltshire Council in response to this.

Lastly Cllr Kay reported that the Bradford on Avon Town Council's 2019/20 budget had been agreed at Full Council with a 6% increase on the current precept with £10k being approved for the for the Environment and Planning committee.

#### 62. St Margaret's Wall

Cllr Kay reported that 'Capital expenditure' had been considered within the BOATC budget for the reconfiguration of St Margaret's Wall and was awaiting further investigation and quotes for the works.

#### 63. Recycling of Crips packets

The Clerk reported that she was still awaiting a reply from Wiltshire Air Ambulance Funding department for the receipt of return labels.

#### 64. Wiltshire Housing Site Allocation Plan

The document had been circulated with the agenda and was noted. It focused consultation on the Schedule of Proposed Changes and associated changes with site allocation plans for additional housing in Wiltshire. A comment date of  $22^{nd}$  January was required. It appeared that Bradford on Avon was not included within the document. Cllr Gibson **agreed** to make further enquiries with Wiltshire Council to confirm if this was correct.

The meeting closed at 8.30 p.m.
