#### 106. Minutes

It was proposed by Cllr E Franklin seconded by Cllr D Newton and with all in favour **RESOLVED** to approve the minutes for the 10<sup>th</sup> September 2019 and the delegated recommendations for 1<sup>st</sup> October 2019 as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

#### 107. Declarations of interests - none

The Chair agreed to bring forward Agenda items 7 & 11

#### 108. Delegation from Girl Guides and BOA Youth Group

12 yr. old Ellie Davies from BOA Girl Guide group gave a presentation about 'Hotels for Bees and insects'. Her project was inspired when she attended the Climate Emergency Steering Group where guest speaker Bernard Steele gave a talk on 'the life cycle of a bee'. Bee Hotel frames were constructed by Ellie's Uncle and filled with material provided by fellow Guides to encourage the insects. Suggested locations for the 'Hotels' are Westbury Gardens, Bearfield, and Christchurch.

Chloe Hart and Bryony Manning from BOA Youth Group gave a Power Point presentation on Climate Emergency and how the Youth Club are contributing to the Climate Emergency issues. The slide show and video will be used at the Climate Emergency event on the 14<sup>th</sup> November.

109. 19/09366/OUT- Land East of Cemetery Lane - Gillian Ellis-King gave a comprehensive report concerning the application made by Redcliffe Homes to build 42 dwellings on the Holt Road. Redcliffe had submitted plans because they claimed that the planning application should be included in the Housing Site Allocation for 2026. but this in incorrect, as the 5-year land supply had already been covered. The site lies outside the Settlement Boundary as reviewed by the Neighbourhood Plan and thus is contrary to the policy. A key area of concern was the disruption of a designated green space that includes a wide access road. The development would cause access problem onto Woolley Street which is unsuitable for the development traffic. There were several other objections to the Outlined planning application which were discussed with

Councillors and Woolley residents. It concluded that little had changed from the previous 2016

application which was rejected.

Cllr Kay proposed, Cllr Newton seconded and with all in favour proposed that in principle BOATC will not support this application. It was <u>agreed</u> that Councillors would consult with WC Planning prior to the BOATC Environment & Planning committee meeting on the 5<sup>th</sup> November when the Redcliffe Homes application will be considered and finalised with a formal Refusal recommendation.

110. Planning Applications

It was proposed by Cllr J Parker seconded by Cllr D Newton and with all in favour it was **RESOLVED:** To send the planning recommendations to Wiltshire Council.

112. Climate Emergency Meeting

A copy of the Draft Climate Emergency Steering Group Ideas and Actions document (as circulated with the Agenda and to Climate Emergency Steering Group members) was reviewed. An in-depth discussion took place. Ideas and suggestions were received, noting that further categorisation, prioritisation and completion of tasks should be included into the document format. Rachel Berger (Climate Friendly) offered to assist Cllr Kay with this task. On completion of the amendments the list will be revisited at the next Climate Steering Group session on November 14th at 7.00 p.m. in St Margaret's Hall.

113. Chairman's Report

(See attached) It was agreed to send the link referring to the BANES Clean Air Zone consultation which closes on 20<sup>th</sup> October, to all members of the CEM Steering Group. It was noted that a sign was required for the location of the Water Fountain in Culver Close and, for other Water Fountains.

114. Committee Action Plan

The Action plan as circulated with the agenda was discussed agreeing in principle with the allocation of funding. It was noted that 3 Water Fountains and a Community Fridge had recently been installed, leaving a balance remaining of £4615 for 2019/20. The Community Fridge had been approved by the Community & Recreation Committee. Further allocations of £10,000 per year for 2020/21 and 2021/2 were earmarked predominantly for Community Projects and actions towards the Climate Emergency Funds. It was agreed that the Chair would discuss the funding of £10,000 earmarked for re-design of Westbury Gardens Wall which had been included under the Environment & Planning budget with the Director of Operations.

- 3. a need for an appeal fund to allow for public awareness
