34. Minutes

It was proposed by the Chairman seconded by Cllr Gibson and with 5 in favour it was **RESOLVED**: To accept the minutes from the last meeting dated 23rd November 2022 as a true record.

35. Matters arising

Minute number 31. War Memorial – Cllr McNeill-Ritchie explained that the grant application information and quotes were collated now and ready to submit by the deadline of 28th February 2022. He hoped to have this done by 1st November 2022. Director of Operations explained that the Canadian war memorial will be moved and put on a plinth closer to the war memorial.

36. Declarations of interest - none

37. Chairman's Report

Chairman explained that he had attended a wash up meeting for the 2021 Christmas lights, which also served as a kick-off meeting for 2022. The 2021 event was a major success and we received lots of positive feedback from residents and visitors. Plans for this year are already shaping up and we are hoping to make it even bigger and better, with some exciting ideas in the pipeline.

With regards to Culver Close following the consultation in 2021 there will be a presentation from the architect in the next month or so.

As mentioned at Full Council earlier this month, we are now expecting asset transfer from Wiltshire council to take place imminently following the cabinet member decision paper. The Director of Operations will be meeting Wiltshire Council Officers in early February.

Chairman said that the outcome from the lottery bid for the skatepark was due by the end of January. He said we will have an update next time on bids and funding at the next meeting.

38. Woolley Grange - Planning Application Number 2021-10082

It was agreed to send the following recommendation:

The Town Council has no objections in principle to this application and is supportive of this local business which is one of the main businesses in the town and has an excellent reputation. Whilst members were appreciative of the need to update the facilities and impressed by the careful mitigation against loss of green space and sensitive additional accommodation proposed, they were, however concerned about some aspects of the application, as highlighted below:-

- It was felt that there should be a no right turn out of the hotel through Woolley to mitigate possible increases in traffic
- Concern was expressed about the relationship between façade of the listed building and the proposed half underground kitchen and new lift which appears imposing and close.
- The expansion of accommodation into the walled garden was considered over development, and in need of scaling down as it takes away the character of this garden.
- The location of new spa was considered imposing when seen from the path between the main building and the garden. It was felt that the entrance needs softening. These concerns do not outweigh the in principle support for this application.

39. Neighbourhood Plan Working Group

It was noted that one meeting had taken place with Cllrs Kay, McNeill-Ritchie, Gibson, Vigar and Planning Consultant. Locality Grant had been applied for and to meet the criteria there was a need for consultants. Cllr Gibson said that a consultant with an ecologist perspective with a planning background would be useful. Cllr Gibson to ask Strategic Planning for assistance with the technical wording. Cllr Gibson said that housing allocation needs to be considered too. Next steps Vision and option for consultants. Chairman asked for this to be a standing item on the agenda.

40. Delegated decisions

Delegated decisions for 17th November, 1st December, 15th December, 5th January and 19th January 2022 were noted.

41. One Public Estate

Cllr Gibson explained that there will be a meeting tomorrow. She waiting to hear whether the car park had been included for the development phase. Cllr Gibson asked if the members had any objection to her MSE Modern Building Design students studying the possibilities for the station car park and doing an exhibition of their work at the end of the course in St. Margaret's Hall. Chairman thought this a good thing to do. Cllr Kay said the message needs to be clear, that it was an exercise for the students. Cllr McNeill-Ritchie said we need to know what direction Wiltshire Council are helping us work towards and what was likely to be coming along in the future.

42. Old Golf Course Working Group

The Working Group will consist of Cllrs. Bessant, Kay and Potter and Vittles with groups to be approached to join including Preservation Trust, Climate Friendly and Keep it Green Bradford on Avon. It was proposed to have a meeting on the 4th February in the afternoon.

I am writing on behalf of Bradford on Avon Town Council who contacted me regarding a site at the edge of the town which has recently been flagged for potential development.

Residents of Bradford on Avon have found the golf course a wonderful amenity space over the pandemic, the land is privately owned but the Town Council on behalf of the residents is keen to engage with the land owner and try and find a compromise that would allow public access while fulfilling his aspirations for the site.

With that in mind I have been asked to seek clarification from your department concerning the liabilities surrounding the site and closed landfill. If this land was to become community owned, who is responsible if it was contaminated and leaking into the river? What are the ramifications for any community group over the historic landfill?

Dear Michelle,

Thank you for your letter of 21 October to Minister Pow on behalf of Bradford Upon Avon Town Council about a historic landfill site. I am replying as the Minister now responsible for this policy area and apologise for the delay in doing so.

It is the responsibility of local authorities to maintain old landfill sites and more generally to identify contaminated land within their districts. Under environmental law, local councils in England are responsible for identifying contaminated land within their districts. Should they choose to identify old landfill sites as such, known as 'Special Sites', then the Environment Agency (EA) will become responsible for mitigating any risks.

According to EA records, this landfill was operated by Bradford Upon Avon Urban District Council for the deposit of inert, commercial and household waste between 1926 and 1978. This is classed as a historic landfill because it no longer has a license or permit.

Under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 – Part 2A, it is the responsibility of local authorities to inspect their areas to identify contaminated land within their districts. In this case, the local authority responsible for the Part 2A duties would be the unitary authority Wiltshire Council. Wiltshire Council has published their contaminated land inspection strategy on their website.

You can contact Wiltshire Council direct for further information regarding this site including whether they have prioritised this landfill for detailed investigation at: customerservices@wiltshire.gov.uk.

For Wiltshire Council to determine this historic landfill as contaminated land under Part 2A they would have to identify one or more significant contaminant linkages causing unacceptable risks to health or the environment. While there will be landfilled waste in the site, the site would only become contaminated land if exposure pathways existed to create significant risks to receptors on, under or around the site. This would include significant harm to people, property or protected ecological sites (e.g. through migration of gases) or significant water pollution (e.g. through migration of leachate into groundwater or surface water).

Under Part 2A there are two classes of liable persons responsible for remediation of contaminated land. These are:

- Class A Appropriate Persons the persons who caused or knowingly permitted the substances to be in, on or under the land; and where no Class A Person can be found after reasonable enquiry – liability transfers to:
- Class B Appropriate Persons the current owner or occupier of the land.

The Contaminated Land Statutory Guidance includes detailed provisions regarding liability including a series of exclusion and apportionment tests. It is, for example, possible for a Class A person who caused or knowingly permitted the substances to be in, on or under the land to sell the land with information to another member of that Class A liability group who in acquiring the land with knowledge of the contamination then bears liability for remediation of the land.

The Part 2A legislation is complex and if the Town Council are considering purchasing the land they should be advised to seek their own expert legal advice.

I hope this reply is helpful. Please let me know if I can be of any further assistance with this or any other matters in the future.

Refurbishment of Bradford on Avon War Memorial located in Westbury Gardens and the 'V for Victor' Memorial.

Purpose of Report

To seek members approval to appoint contractors to carryout restoration and refurbishment work to the war memorial and restoration work to the 'V for Victor' plaque, to also seek member approval to move the 'V for Victor' plaque to a new location.

Background

War Memorial.

The war memorial in Westbury Gardens was erected in 1922 to commemorate the 1914-1918 war, a stone plinth with a tall square obelisk and tapered top. Walter Hume Long, 1st Viscount Long of Wraxall, unveiled the memorial. There are two bronze tablets with the names of those that fell in the Great War. 125 names arranged alphabetically (Adams C.E to White W.) without rank or regiment. The monument was cleaned, and some repointing work was carried out in the year 2000.

The current state as per the War Memorial Trust report in June 2020:

"Stone is weathered and deteriorating after 98 years of standing. Bradford on Avon Town Council are seeking a refurbishment programme to match the 100-year anniversary in 2022."

Advice has been sort from the War Memorial Trust on what and how work should be carried out.

'V for Victor' plaque.

Installed in 1994, a wall mounted brass plaque, mounted on the side of "Westbury Annex" under a tree. The inscriptions are inlaid with enamel, commemorating:

425 (RCAF) Sqn Halifax LE693 KW-V. It had departed Tholthorpe at 1630 on 26/03/44 on a test flight. Whilst over Wiltshire at approximately 10,000ft, the Pilot lost control of the aircraft and ordered the crew to bail out. Three did so immediately, although one of these - the Flight Engineer tragically fell to his death after falling through a loosely fitted parachute harness. The Mid Upper Gunner survived, as did a member of the Sqn Ground Crew, conducting trials on the onboard "Gee" and H2S radio equipment. For unknown reasons, other members of the crew did not bail out. Witnesses in Bradford on Avon saw, the by now very low flying aircraft, circling the town presumably looking for a suitable field to attempt a

forced landing. Eventually it was seen with smoke and flames streaming from one of its engines, which was now on fire. In the last minutes, three more crew, the Navigator, Bomb Aimer, and Wireless Operator were seen to bail out directly over the town. Tragically they were all killed as they were too low for their chutes to fully deploy. The aircraft crashed in a field above the town with the Pilot and Rear Gunner both still on board, exploding on impact. The Pilot was killed in the crash, yet rescuers managed to free the Rear Gunner from his turret. Sadly, he died shortly afterwards. The Mid Upper Gunner later returned to Ops, only to be killed in the loss of 425 (RCAF) Sqn Halifax LW672 KW-N over the Ruhr on 18-19/7/44.

In 1994 the ex-Cpl radio technician, flew in from Canada to attend the unveiling of this memorial plaque and family and representatives from Canada, of the crew, have come to visit on many occasions.

War memorial report dated August 2021

While the plaque is still visible some of the enamel has worn off the names listed, making them hard to read. The wooden back board is also worn due to its outside position under the tree.

Proposal

War Memorial.

Proposed works to be carried out by a professional stone mason.

Temporary scaffold to be erected to access to full height of memorial. The memorial will be fenced off for security. Paving and steps to be cleaned with Thermatec Steam Cleaner. Hand clean areas in recesses. Repoint open and failed joints to steps and paving. Carry out fine mortar repairs and repointing to any areas of delaminating or soft beds of stone to carved detail, over entire monument. Apply sheltercoat to areas of frassing.

'V for Victor' plaque.

The plaque is to be removed from the wall, and a specialist will clean and restore the brass with Pre-Lim, a very fine abrasive paste, and then apply Renaissance micro-crystalline wax to inhibit tarnishing. They will also re-paint the lettering using appropriate materials. The plaque will then be put on a new plinth, with chemically inert properties. The new plinth will be placed near the main war memorial, so the plaque is more prominent.

Considerations

The War Memorial Trust has given some specific advice on what and how any works should be carried out and quotes based on this advice have been sort. The main memorial will only be hand cleaned as that is what has been advised.

A grant application has been submitted to the War Memorials Trust for 75% of the cost of the project (the most they are willing to fund). Once the grant has been approved or rejected, we can proceed with the work.

The advice from the War Memorial Trust regarding the "V for Victor" is that they are happy to part fund the cleaning and repainting of the "V for Victor" plaque but not the new plinth.

The current location of the 'V for Victor' memorial on the wall of Westbury House under the tree, has resulted in the deterioration of the wooden back board and staining of the plaque, the location is also partly hidden. It would be sensible to take this opportunity to the plaque once it has been restored, that a new plinth is built in Westbury Gardens, in a more prominent position.

The cost of the new plinth is £600

The War Memorial Trust only required two quotes for the grant application and the work is also very specialist, so only two quotes have been sort.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Town Council,

- 1) Appoint Contractor 1 to carry out the work to the War memorial.
- 2) Appoint Contractor A to carry out works to the V for Victory plaque.
- 3) Approve the move of the plaque.

Place Shaping Priorities

Following on from the Local Plan Review consultation Wiltshire Council ran last year, I've updated the Place Shaping Priorities slightly (please see below) and would like to run this by the Town Council.

I've outlined a fairly minimal change to the priorities as through the review we will be updating a number of policies which mean certain issues won't also need to be addressed through the Place Shaping Priorities. For example, there was a suggestion from the Town Council to add a new priority which addresses the climate emergency however this will be addressed as a wider policy within the Local Plan. Although if there was a more specific aim or project that you'd want to pursue, that could be discussed.

Comments from the public were largely supportive of the priorities, particularly affordable housing and improving air quality. There was also support for addressing the climate emergency and protecting public green space. The latter is a priority which, to an extent will be supported by the Green Blue Infrastructure Strategy. However, again, if there was a specific project or idea related to green space, that could be discussed. There is of course also the Neighbourhood Plan which could include other policies.

- i. Delivery of employment growth and retention of all existing employment sites
- ii. Provision of affordable housing to help reduce high levels of need in the town
- iii. Improved air quality within the town centre of Bradford on Avon, reducing the impact of traffic, particularly within the Air Quality Management Area
- iv. Continue to conserve, maintain, and enhance the unique historic architecture and recognise and give proper attention to the landscape character of Bradford on Avon
- v. Improve the pedestrian and cyclist environment through and around the town
- vi. Achieve high quality design in new buildings and the public realm that respects and responds to its context.
