Play area improvements to start soon

he latest plan for improving the play area in Poulton Park has been unveiled, and the new design reflects what people have said to us about the types of play opportunities they want to see – and the materials they would prefer to be used in constructing and equipping the play area.

The new design, which you can see over the page, is more ambitious than the plans we shared last September. However, it is also more expensive, and because of this, we have to split the project into phases.

The first phase is scheduled to start in early June and should be finished in time for the school holidays.

We are also going to be working on designs for a sand pit and a mud kitchen, and will be planting new trees in and around the play area this autumn.

The rest of the design will be carried out in phases, and we are working hard to secure additional funding to complete the project.

Veterans sleep out to help out



■ Armed forces veterans slept out overnight in Westbury Garden at the end of March to raise much-needed money for homeless comrades. The Great Tommy Sleep Out – a Royal British Legion national appeal – was organised locally by the Bradford on Avon Armed Forces and Veterans Club. Club spokesperson Christine Giles said: "We've raised £1,450 already and will keep the collection open until the end of April. There shouldn't be one war hero or veteran homeless, let alone 6,000." - In an initiative aimed at allowing people to 'try before they buy' the council has set up a low-energy cooking appliance loan scheme. This scheme was launched in collaboration with Climate Friendly BoA to let residents try out low-energy appliances including air fryers and pressure cookers before buying. ■ The town council has purchased an e-bike for residents to borrow for 1 or 2 weeks to see if an e-bike might work for them. E-bikes are becoming increasingly popular as a healthy and low-carbon alternative to cars.
